Confronting Death: A Christian Approach to the End of Life

Salem's Care Team invites you to a series of conversations on the topic of how Christians face death. The 1-hour sessions will be held in the Chapel at Salem on Tuesday (Feb. 1, 8, 15, 22 and Mar. 1) beginning at 10 a.m.

Weekly topics include:

1. Discovering Serious Illness.

When someone you know says, "I have cancer," how do you react to these words about death?

2. Caring For The One Who Is Not Sick.

Attention in a terminal illness is often focused on the person who is dying. Yet in actuality the caregiver may be in greater need of help.

3. Grieving Before Death

Knowing Christ's voice is critical to overcoming the fear of death.

4. How Do We Handle The Pain

What helps you to endure pain?
What seems to make it worse?

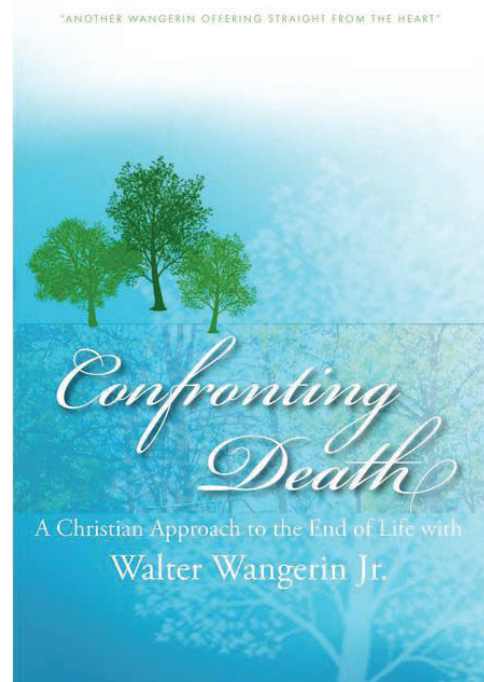
5. Confronting the Dying Itself

How does this thought strike you?
How can you prepare to meet that day?

The DVD resource, *Confronting Death: A Christian Approach to the End of Life*, featuring Walter Wangerin will be used each week. *Confronting Death* has been described as "an hour-shy homily on the subject by a man who is himself in the last stages of a terminal illness...the film features the author describing how, after being diagnosed with lung cancer, his faith helped him accept the disease, as well as prepare himself, his

wife, and children for his eventual death...Wangerin's message takes a conventional Christian approach, while his engaging conversational style builds an easy rapport with the viewer, who can't help but be moved by the poignancy of the subject matter."

Walter Wangerin, Jr., is the award-winning author of some 35 books, including the best-selling *The Book of God* and the National Book Award-winning *The Book of the Dun Cow*. He has also been featured in several other DVD's including *Growing Together: Building a Marriage that Lasts*, *The Lord's Prayer: Entering into God's Country* and *The Four Acts of Prayer*. From 1994 through January 2005 Wangerin was the *Lutheran Vespers* radio speaker, a ministry of the ELCA. He currently holds the Jochum Chair at Valparaiso University.

Council Minit-Highlights

January 12, 2011

“Seeking Clarity in Mission and Ministry”

Our Mission Statement:

“Celebrating Christ’s Love Through Hearts That Care and Hands That Share”
A Shared Vision for the Future to Which God Is Calling Us

The Council meeting held on January 12th was devoted to the church finances. Jim Ballenthin spoke to the council with encouragement and suggestions. He said like all councils, this council faces some tough decisions. Not all decisions are going to be unanimous; however, it is important that the council strive for substantial consensus on all important decisions, and that the entire council support a decision once it is made. The Special Finance Committee took their work very seriously and made some good recommendations to the council; follow their recommendations. This council has been talking about holding a special congregational meeting. Plan for that meeting, make sure the issue for action is clear, and seek council consensus on the action the council recommends to the congregation, along with the reasons for the action. The congregation looks to the council for direction and guidance. Communication is important. Jim also spoke about the monies in the savings and CD. The congregation will need to decide how this money is used.

Ardis Aagard, treasurer, announced that the general fund for 2010 ended the year with a zero balance. The council is very grateful to all the people who so generously helped this happen.

The council talked about the remaining commitment to the Synod Benevolence of \$10,500 for 2010 and how to fulfill the commitment. After a lot of discussion the council decided to take the monies from Fine Arts-\$500, Office Equipment Reserve-\$4,000, Camp Scholarships-\$1,620, Capitol Improvement \$4,000 and Benevolence-\$380 totaling \$10,500. This is the balance owed to the Synod. The council also discussed the benevolence payments for 2011. They decided to look at benevolence as a monthly bill and pay 1/12 each month. The council set the commitment to the Synod for 2011 at \$8,000. We can always pay more.

Rebecca Waterhouse asked for a leave of absence for the month of January. The council approved this. The council also decided to give Waterhouse a donation from the Good Samaritan Fund of \$2,700.

The council decided not to be a sponsor of the Cass County Maps this year.

The council reconvened on January 26th to conduct the monthly business.

Membership - The council approved having Life Touch Company for a new church picture directory. This will be at no cost to the congregation. The pictures will probably be taken the last week of March and the last week of June.

Table Topics - The council discussed the table topic for February. The topic will be Salem's Vision Statement. What it means to the church and what does it mean for individuals. It is important to the council that people at the tables take a few minutes to discuss the table topic and then give the comments on it. These discussions and comments will help everyone when we start the visioning process.

Finances - The council has set a three month freeze on discretionary spending.

Written reports: **Pastor's Report:**

Education. Extravaganza 2011! This year’s extravaganza to be held on Saturday, March 12th at Our Savior’s Lutheran Church, Cloquet from 9:15 a.m. – 4 p.m. is a congregational resource event designed to spark new interest in lifelong learning of Scripture and help participants grow more theologically mature. Presenter is Dr. Jessicah Duckworth, Assistant Professor of Christian Formation and Teaching at Wesley Theological Seminary. Workshops on —nuts and boltsll topics such as finances and resource ideas for children’s ministry will be a part of the day. Cost is \$20/person (\$15 for groups of four or more from the same congregation) or \$25/person at the door. Registration deadline is March 1st. Registration forms are available from Carol.

Bishop’s Theological Convocations. —Making Sense of Scripture in the 21st Centuryll is an event for laypersons to be held at Bethany Lutheran Church, Cromwell on Sunday, January 30th from 2-4:30 p.m. Dr. David Lose, Marbury E. Anderson Chair in Biblical Preaching at Luther Seminary, is the presenter. Registration fee is \$10. Forms are available from Carol.

Youth and Family Program Support. Louise Daudt, Ginger Minske and I met to discuss support options for youth and family ministry programs in Rebecca’s absence, specifically confirmation night (small group facilitation and recruiting meal providers), recruiting Third Sunday hosts, Kids’ Church facilitator for Rebecca’s Sunday class, and Northland school food drop. Billie Jo Lilyquist, Ginger and Louise facilitated the confirmation small group discussion last Wednesday. A follow up

meeting was held to explore ways to help the leaders improve the functioning of the class time for both leaders and students. An email reminder was sent out to students and parents to bring their course books and Bible to the class sessions and to encourage more parents to attend. Rebecca expects to return at the end of the month. Souper Bowl of Caring Sunday is February 6th.

Divine Drama. Open to all congregational members, the present unit meets each Wednesday at 6:30 p.m. through March 2nd. The goal of the course is to lead participants through the threads and themes of the Bible's story-line and to show Jesus as the —Grand Finale of Scripture. There is a special focus on walking in the way of servanthood. Following the large group presentation, the class breaks into generational groups for small group discussion.

Publicity. Salem has been one of the advertisers for the **Cass County Map** produced by Heartland Map Company the past two years. Roger Dickenson, sales representative, phoned today about our continued participation, including any updates to the information appearing in our ad (**see last year's map and ad**). The fee of \$185 remains unchanged from last year and includes a quantity of maps delivered to the church as well as air time publicity for the church on several radio stations (Power Loon, WJJY, etc.). Mr. Dickenson needs our reply this week, including any changes regarding our worship times or other information we may wish to highlight. The layout will be forwarded to the printer this Friday. Although this has been budgeted, given our cautious financial agenda, I prefer council make the call on whether to fund this. Also, with current discussions over the summer worship schedule, I am reluctant to call the shots on advertising future worship times.

Community Lenten Services. Lent begins on Ash Wednesday, March 9th. The two cooperating churches (Salem and Longville Community) are planning to continue the practice of midweek services and soup suppers rotated between the two churches during the five middle weeks of Lent.

Synod Assembly. Registration deadline for Salem's council-appointed delegates to the Synod Assembly is March 1st. The Assembly is held at Cragun's Resort Center, Brainerd on April 29—May 1. The theme is —The Word Working in the World based on Isaiah 55:10-11. Keynote Presenter and workshop leader is Rev. John Nunes, president of Lutheran World Relief.

Cass County Chaplaincy. I will be the chaplain on-call for the Cass County Sheriff's Office during the week of January 17th. Chaplains from Cass County will be attending the annual training event at the Hackensack Senior Center on Thursday, January 27th

Change of Call Status. Thea has discontinued her call as pastor of St. Paul's Lutheran Church, Hackensack, effective January 15th. This change will impact the medical/dental rate billed to Salem by the Board of Pensions. With rostered clergy couples serving separate congregations, each congregation shares this expense. With only one rostered pastor, the full cost of the clergy family's medical/dental benefit is paid by the calling congregation at the rate defined by the Board of Pensions. This would continue until Thea accepts another call.

Secretarial Status. February leave time.

Membership Service Ministry Team - (Dick Loeffler) **Membership Audit** is being done. Letters will be sent to inactive members (members who have not contributed or communed in 2 years). **Peace Candle** - Doris and Larry Nelson have given out 24 or so Peace Candles since last October. **Pictorial Church Directory** - The Team recommends Life Touch Company to do a new pictorial church directory at no cost to the church. **Mailings**- The Team would like to do either an Easter or Christmas post card mailing. Four zip codes would cost \$700 for 3,000 cards. Half this amount if we sent it only to two zip codes (Longville & Hackensack).

Youth and Family Service Ministry Team - (Ginger Minske) Rebecca and I met on December 15th. We had a good discussion talking about her position and what her needs were. I asked her to tell me about her job description which we will talk about at our next meeting. After listening to her I encouraged her to ask for help instead of trying to do everything by herself. I feel she is wearing herself out and there are others who would be willing to help when asked. One wish that Rebecca had was could the prayers be mentors for the child they are praying for?

I'm starting to get a committee together and so far I have 2 members: Eunice Benson will help with the music and Sandy Roscoe will be in charge of the Prayer Project Lifesaver. I would like to have a parent of one of the teenagers, a parent of the younger children, and a teenage youth on the committee.

Since Rebecca's absence Louise (Daudt) and I have taken her confirmation class. An interesting experience. Laura Wheeler is going to teach the younger children on Sunday mornings. I know some of the youth and prayers went to the movies. This was a wonderful event to build relationships between the youth and older members.

I met with Dennis Zuelke and we discussed working on a grant. He gave me suggestions of different areas that we could be working on. He feels the council should be working on these together.

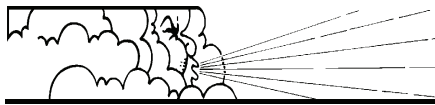

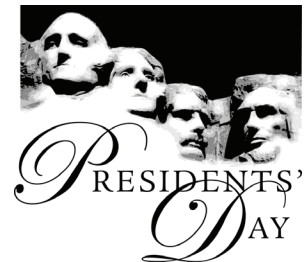

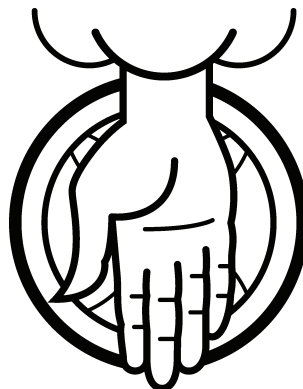

PIECES OF LOVE



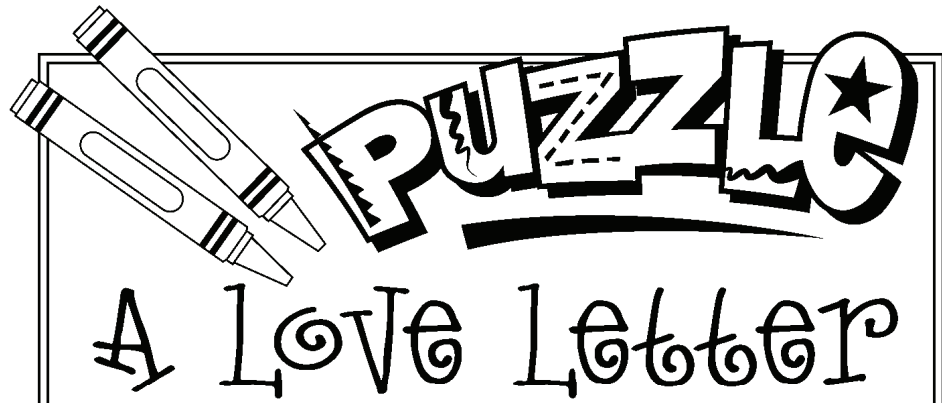
Send special reminders of your love by creating messages that people can assemble and enjoy.
