Our youth will be receiving a special offering during the worship service. They will join young people in churches across the country to collect money for those who are hungry and hurting. In 2011, \$9.5 million was collected by Souper Bowl of Caring participants for local charities.

Super Bowl Sunday is the second largest food consumption day of the year, being topped only by Thanksgiving. Let's see what we can do to feed some people today who are going without.

Please drop \$1, or better yet, the price of a meal, into your team's soup pot this morning. Thank You.

Tackle Hunger

Souper Bowl of Caring (SBoC) is a national youth-led movement, 260,000 strong, that empowers youth to collect dollars and food for people in need and volunteer in local communities. In recent years, more than \$10 million has been collected annually to fight hunger and poverty.

We use the energy of the Super Bowl football game to mobilize youth to assist hunger-relief agencies at a time when food consumption is high, yet donations have decreased after the holidays.

We fight hunger and poverty because hunger isn't something that only impacts third world countries. One in six people in America (one in four children) live in food insecure households.

We are building future philanthropists. We create programs that introduce young people to community service and inspire the next generation of philanthropists.

100% of the money collected each year by youth through the Souper Bowl of Caring is donated directly to local charities. None of this money comes back to Souper Bowl of Caring headquarters.

Our national staff is small and efficient. Our staff of four full and seven part-time people create and distribute resource materials at no charge to more than 14,000 groups each year.

“40 Days of Listening...40 Ways to Care”

This is the program that the Caring Ministry Team is hosting during Lent. “40 Days of Listening...40 Ways to Care” is a way to carry the Good News of the Savior’s love to bring new life, new hope and healing in the hearts and homes of the families of Salem during the 40 days of Lent.

During the period when a church has an interim pastor is a good time for introspection and planning for the future. During 2012 we as a church will be looking at our congregational needs and the future we want with our new pastor. Everyone’s thoughts, ideas and dreams are important and need to be heard. During Lent 20 “Visitor Teams” will visit with every family in Salem. The teams will consist of two Salem members who have been trained to listen to what you have to say.

As the Visitor Teams listen to your thoughts, ideas and dreams they will make notes and share helpful reflections with Pastor Svingen. He will follow through with particular needs, requests, to the appropriate staff and/or lay leaders of the congregation.

The Visitor Teams will be commissioned on February 19th. The family visits will take place between February 27th and March 31st. Each team will visit four families. A team member will be calling you to set a time, date and place to meet. Visits can take place in homes, at church or at a place of your choosing. The visit will take about 45 minutes and will be informal. If you are not in Longville during this time period, you will be contacted when you come home.

We ask that you will say “yes” when you are called. Before your meeting please take some time to think about what you see as the future of Salem. We also ask that you pray for this visitation ministry to be one that bears the fruit of God’s Spirit of healing, hope and forgiving love.

We want to thank everyone for taking part in this program. This is Salem’s future and your input is important.

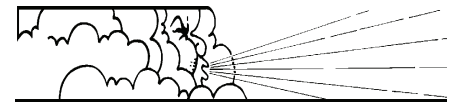

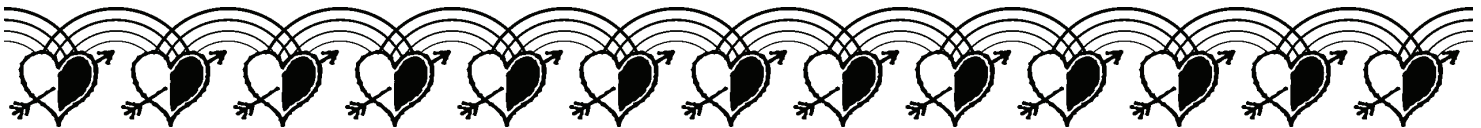

This number appears many times in Scripture, often indicating a time of trial or testing, or simply marking something significant. It rained 40 days and nights during the Great Flood. Israel wandered in the wilderness for 40 years. Jesus fasted 40 days and was with the disciples for 40 days between his resurrection and ascension. Taking this symbolic number to heart, the Christian church has long observed 40 days of Lent (not counting Sundays).

The women's board met on January 6, 2012 at Salem and we discussed many areas.

April 18: General Meeting: We are looking for a speaker for a good program. Ruth Circle will be serving.

May: We are planning a one day retreat.

June: Women's convention in Duluth.

June, July and August will be smorgasbord months: Doris Schmidt has agreed to be the coordinator. Thank you Doris

September: will be our craft sale during the Fall Has It All festivities instead of December. We have so much talent so please think about how you can help us.

October: Bible Study ???

November: Thank offering service ???

December: Cookie plates and gifts for homebound.

February: We are planning for a **drive to help with the needs of the homeless** in Brainerd during the month of February. This will be a congregation project. We have done this for the street ministry in Duluth and it was so appreciated and a great way to share God's love by helping those in need. FORGIVENESS Game

Try this twist on musical chairs.

What you need:

- 28 large index cards
- Black marker
- Two teams of people
- Radio or CD player

What you do:

1. On index cards, write out *forgiveness*, one letter per card. Make two sets (two F's, two O's, etc.).
2. Mix up the cards and form them face up in a circle on the floor. (You'll have six blanks mixed in.)
3. Have teams mix themselves up and stand in a circle around the cards. Ask an extra person to turn the music on and off.
4. As the music plays, teams walk around the circle. When the music stops, players each pick up the card nearest them.
5. Team members take their cards to a designated area and try to spell forgiveness. Any double letters or blanks go back to the "music person," who reorganizes remaining cards, spacing them evenly into a fresh circle.
6. Play continues until one team spells *forgiveness*.
