"12 in 2012" - Year of Renewal

In our daily lives, renewal is essential to the freedoms we enjoy. If you fail to renew your auto license, you risk not being free to drive without penalty. If you fail to renew your homeowners, auto, or health insurance policies, there are consequences not particularly attractive to your continued well-being. You lose some helpful supports in your life.

All congregations, like some I know, stand to benefit when members are invited to renew their membership commitments. Marriages stand to benefit when the couple renews their wedding day promises. Confirmed Christians are blessed when they regularly confess the creed they spoke before God and the congregation on the day they publicly affirmed their baptism. In his Reformation Era Treatise on *The Freedom of The Christian Man*, Martin Luther declared that "the Christian is the freest of Lords subject to none, and (at the same time) the most dutiful of servants subject to all". That means us.

While the members and friends have in the past engaged in these and other "expressions of Christian Freedom", there have been words and deeds, misunderstandings, unmet expectations, and various forms of failings that have collaborated to compromise the spiritual unity of 'the Body of Christ' here at Salem. In a congregation, the pastor, by virtue of the office of pastor, cannot be exempt from the emotional processes that either unite a congregation into 'one body' or divide it into two or more component parts of what was intended to function as a whole, healthy, life-giving body.

We all know well that when the functioning of our own human body parts breaks down, we become diseased. This disease may be understood as an imbalance among the physical, psychological and spiritual components of the intended whole. "*I have come that you might have life*" Jesus proclaimed, "*and have it in abundance.*" For some time now, and even for some members at present, the "Body of Christ" at Salem bears wounds that cloud the vision of the abundant life that Christ came to bring to us, his beloved children of the light. It is God's time that this interim period sets before us as 'the time' to participate in the crafting of a new vision for what The Church of Jesus Christ is..., and can become here at Salem, as well. It is time for renewal at Salem.

Therefore, as your interim pastor and 'temporary shepherd' sent to Salem for a leadership role in the work of spiritual renewal, I invite you to participate in the renewal opportunities that 2012 sets before us all. "**12 in 2012**" refers to 12 specific Sundays/related events that we will lift up as focused renewal offerings to God. (review Romans 12:1-2)

The first of these twelve major Sundays is February 19th, Transfiguration Sunday, when all worshippers will be invited to renew their commitment to membership and faithful service to Christ in His Church at Salem. In the meantime, I invite you to pray for this effort at congregational renewal...so that Christ, our chief shepherd, might be glorified. I call upon you to lean into the healing Word of He who was made flesh to dwell among us full of grace and truth.

Meditate on The Word: (from 2nd Isaiah, chapter 43) "*Remember not the former things, nor consider the things of old. Behold, I am doing a new thing; now it springs forth, do you not perceive it? I will make a way in the wilderness and rivers in the desert.*"

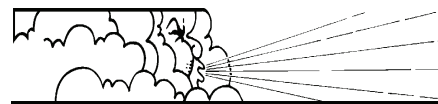
HOSPITALITY TEAMS ARE COMING

December 14, 2011

“Seeking Clarity in Mission and Ministry”

Our Mission Statement:

Absent: Ardis Aagard, Sandre Strausser

Devotions: Led by Pastor Paul. Gerhard Frost “Christmas Lesson”. What gifts do we bring to church? What are some “new gloves” you can think of at church? 1) getting youth program going, 2) hope, 3) seeing new faces in church.

Secretary’s Report/Fischer: 1) Make PDF files to send out as emails to council members as some members cannot open Windows 7, 2) In the Membership report, strike last sentence about not having enough time to get out a Christmas mailing. We did the mailing. Approved Sjodin/K Daudt/Passed with corrections made.

Treasurer’s Report/Aagard: Ardis was unable to attend due to need to be with Hans following his fall.

Financial Secretary’s Report/Waldera: Suggestion to think about a spending freeze for the winter months, or at least be careful in our spending. Approved Fischer/Johnson/Passed.

Pastor Paul’s Report: Condition of our Church? Proposal: 1) Let go of the past by creating a new future. 2) We all should spread the good word.

Hospitality Teams/Osmundson: Ardis had asked earlier about adding coffee servers to the teams. Every council member is asked to sign up to serve on a Hospitality Team so as to be “council member on duty” up to 4 Sundays per year.

Transition Task Force/Nelson: No decision has been made as yet for the Chair position. One person has indicated a willingness to serve as Chair. The Chair person will oversee the functioning of the 3 component teams. (Mission/Vision, Self Examination, and Leadership). Several possible appointees are considering the position.

Membership/Evangelism/Sjodin & Fischer: 1) A Christmas mailing was sent out before the Longville Area Community Choir Christmas Concert welcoming folks to Salem. 2) Pictorial Directory - if we have 15 member photos there will be no cost to adding a page to the directory. Life Touch will send a photographer. Anyone who missed having their pictures taken could sign up. 3) To date we have one couple wishing to join our church family.

Property/ T Daudt: 1) A part has been ordered for the stove in the kitchen. Fittings were checked and tightened. 2) Discussion of reorganizing the rooms for choir, youth, Sunday School and Confirmation. Motion to approve T Daudt/K Daudt/Passed.

Worship/Osmundson: Motion to approve Hospitality Teams, Fischer/Johnson/Passed. The functioning of the 4 teams will be reviewed by the Worship Committee and then reported to council in 6 months.

Stewardship: Not available

Fellowship: Not available

Education/Youth/K Daudt & Limburg: Preparations are being made for Sunday School starting January 8th. Motion to have carpets cleaned and rooms painted in the education wing and the Martin Luther Room. Limburg/Johnson/Passed.

Old Business: 1) Skype/E Daudt. Skype is working well. Martha Limburg took an active part in the council meeting. 2) Auction Funds 2011. Aagard/Fischer/Sjodin met. It is suggested that we give \$1500 to the Food Shelf

and \$3000 to youth camp scholarships. The remainder will be held and decided upon later. Motion made to accept recommendation. Sjodin/T Daudt/Passed.

New Business: InterServe Ministries. For congregations who are going through changes in their Children's/Youth & Family Ministries. A pamphlet was handed out and council members will look it over and bring their thoughts and suggestions next month.

Pastor Paul suggested having 12 special Sundays during 2012. The program would be called "**12 in 2012 - Year of Renewal**". Motion to approve this program. Johnson/K Daudt/Passed. A vinyl sign needs to be made to hang out by the granite sign. February 19 is Transfiguration Sunday and also New Member Sunday. That would be the first of the "12 in 2012" Sundays.

Pastor Paul suggested council think about a retreat for leadership training early in 2012.

Larry Nelson announced a Christian Education Meeting, January 21st at 1st Lutheran, Duluth. Also an Over 50's Meeting, February 26th at 1st Lutheran, Brainerd at 2:00 p.m. Nelson stated that he will be attending a World Hunger Symposium, February 9-12 in Fort Meyers, FL.

Motion to adjourn: Osmundson/Sjodin/Passed.

Meeting ended with the Lord's Prayer.

NOBEL PEACE PRIZE GOES TO A LUTHERAN

One of the Nobel Peace Prize recipients this year was Leymah Roberta Gbowee, from Liberia, Africa. She organized women in Liberia to demonstrate non-violently against a war that went on for over a decade. Women suffered and mourned in silence. Then in 2003, Gbowee urged them to take action. "We were waiting for the bold men, but every time the bold men rose up they rose up with guns," she said. She realized it would have to be the women of Liberia to become the peacemakers.

Soon the original group of 20 grew to thousands. Known as the "women dressed in white," they marched in the streets for peace, help prayer vigils in churches and mosques, and demanded meetings with government and rebel leaders to call for an end to the war.

They became the "Women of Liberia Mass Action for Peace" and successfully led a non-violent movement that ousted President Charles Taylor, brought a 14-year civil war to an end and paved the way for the election of Liberian President Ellen Johnson Sirleaf, the first female president of an African nation.

Little did Leymah realize that her efforts would win her the Nobel Peace Prize. She shares the prize with Sirleaf and Tawakul Karmen, a human rights activist from Yemen. This announcement was made October 7, 2011 in Oslo, Norway.

Since childhood, Leymah has been an active member of the Lutheran Church of Liberia, a companion church of the ELCA. Both the ELCA and the Lutheran Church in Liberia are members of The Lutheran World Federation.

She attended Lutheran schools, and her "first connection with God came from attending the Lutheran Church."

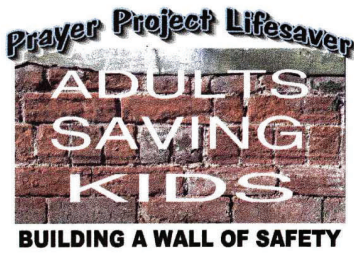

YOUR THRIVENT CHOICE DOLLARS

NO-SEW FLEECE SCARF

Winter is a difficult time for people in need, so make this scarf to help someone stay warm.

What you need:

- Medium-weight polar fleece, 60" standard width (a 9" portion will make one scarf)
- Scissors
- An adult to help

What you do:

1. Cut a piece of medium-weight polar fleece to the size of 60" x 9". Cut the fabric across its width so the material is stretchy.
2. Trim off the edge binding. To add "fringe" along each end, make a 6"-long cut every half inch.
3. For curly fringe, pull each strand and then let go sharply. Another attractive option is to tie an over-hand knot at the top of each strip.
4. Donate your scarf to a local group that helps people in need. For greater impact, encourage your Sunday school classmates or other friends to make scarves, too.
